In 2026, National Police Week runs from May 10–16 and includes memorial services, candlelight vigils, honor guard ceremonies, and survivor events held primarily in Washington, D.C.

Locally, the Fremont Police Department serves as the primary law enforcement agency for Fremont and National Police Week provides an opportunity for the community to recognize the dedication, professionalism, and public service of Fremont officers and staff.

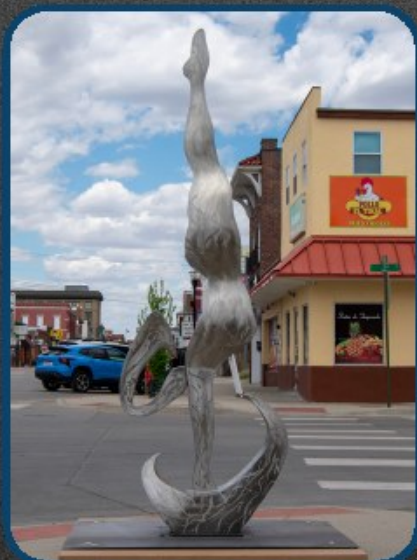

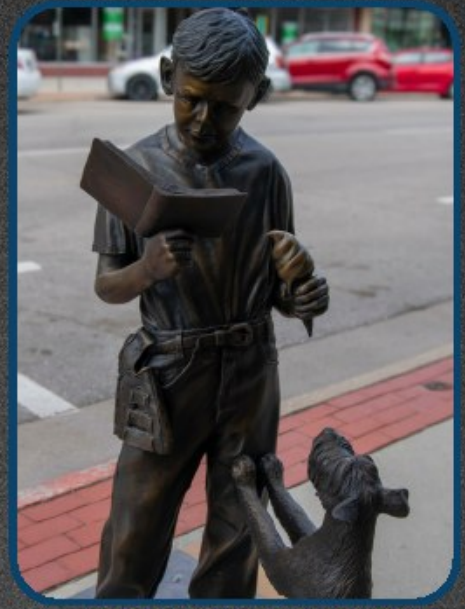

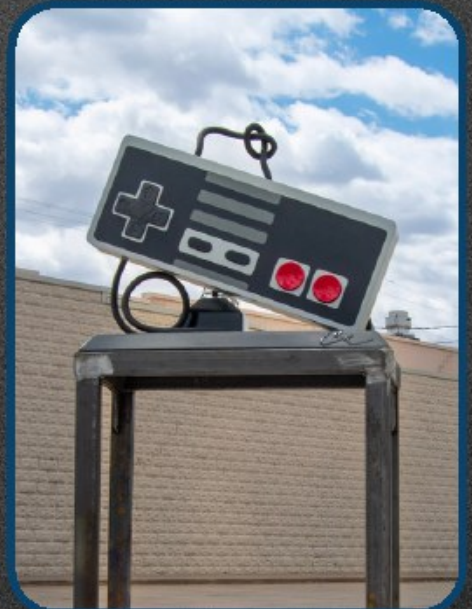
